

<u>Reader's Reflection: You're only as old as you feel ...</u>

Having completed a two year course of study, I was privileged to be licensed by the Bishop of Derby as a Licensed Lay Minister (Reader) at a Service in Derby Cathedral on 20th April. A Reader in the Church of England is a Lay Person who can lead and preach at some Church Services and undertake pastoral work.

Having felt the call from God to this kind of ministry, I started the course when I was 71 and I was the oldest student in my cohort. This has led me to reflect on the role of older people in our Society and community, and I strongly believe that their (our) contribution can be both positive and fulfilling.

Winston Churchill was 65 when he became Prime Minister in May 1940, and the likely two main candidates in this November's US Presidential election - Joe Biden and Donald Trump - will be 81 and 78 respectively.

From the Bible, we're told that Abraham - the father of a great nation and the three great religions of Judaism, Christianity and Islam - was 75 when he received his call from God. And Zechariah and Elizabeth were '*well on in years*' when they became the parents of John the Baptist

Older people have a great deal to contribute - life experience, time, various accumulated skills - in volunteering roles in all sorts of areas. So, to those who have stopped counting birthdays, I say this: *"it's never too late and you won't know what you can achieve unless you try"*.

For the benefit of new Villagers (and indeed a reminder to all Residents) here is the current status of development:-

The Derbyshire Dales Local Plan, published in 2017, called for 99 new houses in the Hulland Ward area to be built by 2040 (subsequently changed to be built by 2035).

To date, including Cameron Homes, Les Ardennes **and** Wheeldon Way (39 homes still to be built) plus a few smaller developments, we will have had 101 houses against the 99 proposed.

Therefore, we have completed our 'quota' and should not be asked to take any more - which is

why your Parish Council vigorously rejected the proposal for a further 15 houses on Land off Biggin View. Although also rejected by District Planning Committee, the proposal was allowed at Appeal and may well go ahead because of this – even though the Application is unsafe as well as in excess to the Local Plan.

Unfortunately, the Local Plan does not seem to be as straightforward as we were led to believe, so we will have to continue 'fighting our corner' as best we can !

Wheeldon Way Development

The Parish Council are aware of the problems of flooding, potholes, noise and vehicular traffic. Representatives from the PC have made 2 formal visits to the site, as well as writing to the Case Officer with complaints.

Our District/County Councillor Dermot Murphy has also intervened on our behalf – and has managed to facilitate some 'pothole filling' as well as other matters.

The Site Foreman is established on-site and will speak to Residents who have particular problems. His office is located on the left side of the site as you enter from Wheeldon Way. Allowing for reasonable weather they hope to have the Showhouses up and running within 3 months.

23/00435/FUL Land off Biggin View, Biggin Parish This application, for a further 15 houses, following rejection by both Parish Council and District Council, has been **allowed under appeal** which means this development can legally progress. The Parish Council understands groundwork could commence late Spring/early Summer - with all construction traffic using the temporary access adjacent to the Dog Lane/Main Road junction.

19/00159/REM Land off Wheeldon Way, Biggin Parish was approved by Derbyshire Dales Planning Committee on 10th September 2020. Groundwork is now well advanced for the 39 mixed properties with brickwork for the Showhouses underway.

For the final layout please refer to the website: www.guildhomes.co.uk Progress will continue to be monitored by the local Residents Committee and the Parish Council until the new site is completed.

21/00644/FUL Land at Eaton Farmhouse, Hulland Ward. This small development of 3 mixed properties is almost complete with just the entrance road to be finished and the verge along the Main Road to be repaired. All work should be completed by end May 2024.

If you see or hear anything which raises concern either contact myself or the relevant authority (eg. Derbyshire Dales District Council, Severn Trent, Openreach, etc.). The more people these authorities hear from the more likely something will happen!

On Saturday, 13th March my wife Judith and daughter Jane put on refreshments for our Annual Hulland Village Social followed by a Litter Pick. The event is being described as "Hugely Successful" because:- our Local MP Sarah Dines came along to meet everyone, answered questions and was involved in the Litter Pick. She was allocated to one of the Six Litter Picking Teams covering approximately six miles of Grass Verges. WOW! This was the first time Hulland Village has received a visit from the standing MP. I have been involved with all 3 previous MPs representing this area (currently Derbyshire Dales but previously named West Derbyshire) covering approximately 60 years, and not one of them came anywhere near to being so pro-active as Sarah, where she is trying her best to solve all problems that are presented to her.

Not surprisingly she was questioned about the appalling problem of Potholes. She answered by saying that Derbyshire County Council had now increased their resources in this area so that they are now repairing 2000 potholes a week. In addition, they are now sealing the edges of the repair so that water can't seep down between the solid road and the repair to destroy the joint in no time causing the repair to break down once again! The recently launched JCB Permanent Pothole Repair Machine was also mentioned which saves Councils both time and money. Sarah promised to put pressure on Derbyshire County



Council to buy a Machine in the new financial year to assess its huge benefits.

We also invited Dermot Murphy to join us. As our Elected Councillor for both Derbyshire County Council and Derbyshire Dales District Council, he has already achieved two major successes for the Village. Dermot accepted our invitation and agreed to do his best to solve three other major problems we have in the area. First, two of our excellent Litter Picking Teams were allocated major sections of Smith Hall Lane. They both had the unenvious task of picking up a large number of water bottles out of the hedge bottoms full of "Human Urine" --Dermot has offered to go and see the Managing Director of Aggregates to see what he or she is prepared to do about stopping the practice of Male Lorry Drivers using this method rather than going to the toilet at the Aggregate Works.

Secondly, Dermot has agreed to come into the Village to take a photo of each Pothole and submit them to Derbyshire County Council so that they are repaired asap. Thirdly Dermot would like a list of all the blocked drains in the Village so that he can make contact with the person responsible for keeping drains clear at Derbyshire County Council. Also, it has been noted in past years that if we start with a Social we have more volunteeers joining the event. This year was particularly special because a number of residents met each other for the first time which can only help to add to the friendly atmosphere that already exists in the Village. Finally, and most importantly, we had a record number of people at the event - 23 - (See photo following this email along with a photo of a record number of bags of litter - 30 - etc collected. Amazing!

In conclusion it is particularly motivational and inspirational to be part of the Hulland Ward and District Group where the three villages, Hulland Ward, Biggin and Hulland Village, get together to be part of our contribution towards the Great British Spring Clean. This year there was a total of 52 people involved and 60 bags of litter collected. -- Absolutely amazing !!

Easter was magical for the children. They created craft items, made biscuits and Easter bonnets.


We welcomed a valued member to our team, who brings experience, depth of knowledge and thoughtful understanding working with children.
