Films at the MVH



Our first film of the year is “Living” starring Bill Nighy whose performance is credited as ‘career-best’. Indeed, he has received his first **Oscar** nomination for the role.

Saturday, 11th February, 2023 at 7pm

This remake of the 1952 Japanese drama ‘Ikuru’ about a man given months to live should not work but it does – *magnificently!*

South African director Oliver Hermanus and Japanese-born British novelist Kazuo Ishiguro have collaborated on this supremely graceful and affecting adaptation, elegantly transposing the story to 1950s London.

In the lead role of Mr Williams, Bill Nighy gives one of the finest (not to say subtlest) performances of his career to date. A veteran civil servant at London County Council, Williams helps direct a stream of documents in brown envelopes around the building in an endless cycle of bureaucratic buck-passing.

Lean and taciturn, he wears his pinstriped suit as if it’s armour, turning his gentlemanly exterior into an iron facade. Then, when he receives some awful news, this composed exterior begins to crack.

‘Living’ is a film that could have so easily smacked of an exercise but its beauty feels thrillingly natural, and its considerable emotional power is honestly earned.

Millennium Village Hall : Here for Our Community

The area has quite a few new residents and I thought for this edition of the Herald I would give some information about our Hall which may be useful for them.

The Millennium Village Hall, situated on Dog Lane next to the Church, is a Charity and the Hall's charitable aims are the provision of a Hall for the benefit of the residents of Hulland Ward, Hulland and Biggin. So, the Hall is truly our Hall.

Anybody can hire it and it is used every day for a variety of purposes from pilates and yoga classes, an AGE UK centre for Over 50s, an art & craft group and a mother and toddler group to name but a few.

All the regular events are held in the week although there is some free space in the day and evening.

The Hall has no regular bookings for the weekend so it could be an ideal venue for a party, children's, (there is enough room for a bouncy castle), or adults (eg. wedding receptions, anniversaries), a family celebration, a club AGM, etc.

Local residents have a reduced hire rate compared with those outside the three parishes. The local hourly hire rate is £13 in the week to 11pm and £16 from 5pm Friday and all weekend again to 11pm. The Hall can be hired after 11pm, but the rate is higher. There is a fully-equipped kitchen with dishwasher.

Hulland Ward Parish Council News

Is the Local Plan to be Trusted ?

The Parish Council wrote to the Chief Executive of Derbyshire Dales District Council, prior to Christmas, seeking guarantees that no further large-scale planning applications would be submitted to the Hulland Ward area now that its target of 101 houses set in the Local Plan had been achieved (which was supposed to prevent further development until 2033).

The reply recently received from Mike Hase, on behalf of the District Council was ambiguous, to say the least. As a result, the Parish Council, particularly with the ongoing problems of the Wheeldon Way development, feel this community has done more than enough to satisfy the Local Plan and will vigorously oppose any future large-scale house building proposals submitted by the District Council.

Speed Cameras for our Village

Records of over one million vehicle movements during the last year through our Village, using the MVAS installed system, have shown that over 30% of motorists are exceeding the speed limit. This fact was the basis of a recent letter from Hulland Ward Parish Council to Derbyshire County Council, requesting Speed Cameras to be fitted to the Main Road of our village.

The official response has been that there have been '**insufficient casualties**' to install speed cameras - end of story!

We find this response to be totally inadequate and have enlisted the help of our County Councillor, Dermot Murphy, to appeal this outcome.

Future progress will be reported in due course.

New Year Report

Happy New Year from everyone at Hulland Church of England Primary School.

January 2023 has started with our first flurries of snow - a chance to view our grounds from a different perspective. Everyone enjoys a snow day at Hulland!

In October we had our Church School Inspection and can proudly report that we continue to be a 'Good' Church School.

Inspection findings celebrated how 'every opportunity is taken so that each pupil feels valued, safe and special'. The inspector recognised how

our pupils are thoughtful, kind and reflective and are enthusiastic about their learning.

He also appreciated the 'delightful outdoor space' which is used well to support pupils' learning and how our extensive grounds support forest schools and other outdoor pursuits.

Our unique position as a small village school in the heart of the local community, close to the Derbyshire Dales and at the gateway to Carsington provides plentiful opportunities for fresh air.

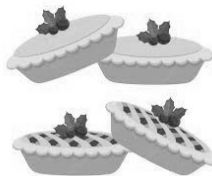

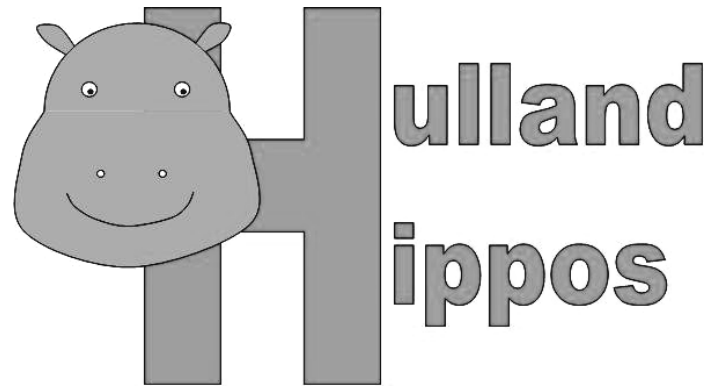
