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What will you be doing on May 6th?

Probably, like most of the UK and the World, sitting in front of a television watching the historic Coronation of King Charles III.

Unless you are aged over 75, this will be the first time to experience such an event live—the late Queen's Coronation has been shown numerous times so lends a clue to the proceedings but it will be fascinating to see it all unfold for real.

The Service will be conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury and will reflect the Monarch's role today and look towards the future, while being rooted in long-standing traditions and pageantry. The latter includes the Coronation Chair (*right*) in which the Stone of Destiny is placed. Every English – and, after 1707 and the Act of Union, British – Monarch since 1296 has sat on the Stone for their Coronation.

The Sovereign's Orb

Created in 1661 for Charles II, damaged in 1671 when Thomas Blood tried to steal the regalia, the Orb shows Christian sovereignty over the Earth. During the ceremony the Archbishop places it in the right hand of the Monarch.



DID YOU KNOW? *The earliest known use of a crown in Britain was discovered by archaeologists in 1988 in Deal, Kent, and dates to between 200 and 150BC.*

Housing Developments

23/00038/OUT Land Adjacent Biggin View, Biggin

Repeat proposal to erect 15 dwelling houses was discussed at Planning Committee on 14th March 2023 and the proposal was rejected by a sound majority. This development is also subject to an Appeal on an earlier submission.

19/00159/REM Land in Biggin, off Wheeldon Way

Proposals to construct 39 mixed properties were approved by Derbyshire Dales Planning Committee 10th September 2020. Groundwork proceeding to plan.

21/00644/FUL Land at Eaton Farmhouse

Proposal to construct 3 mixed properties - due to be completed May/June 2023.

Full details of all the above developments are shown on the Derbyshire Dales District Council Planning Portal.

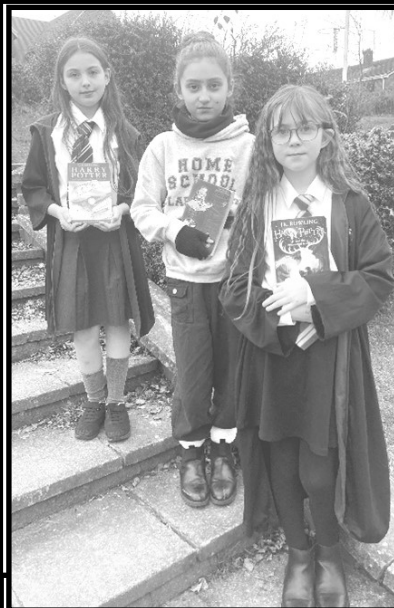
Places are still available (in most year groups) for September 2023, so please come and visit us if you are interested. Every day is an Open Day.

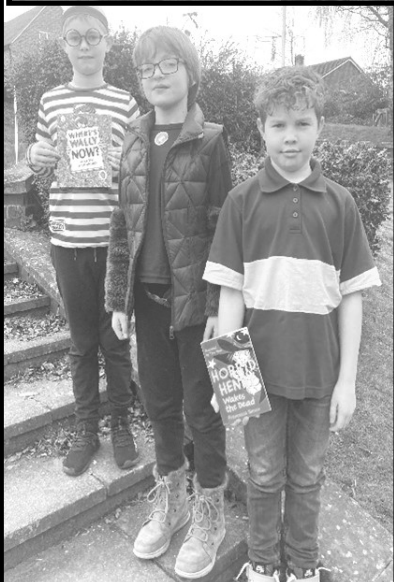


World Book Day

Can you spot the characters represented by some of the children in Class 3?

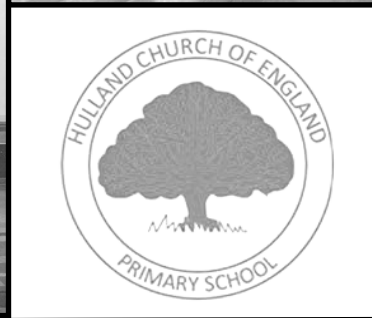
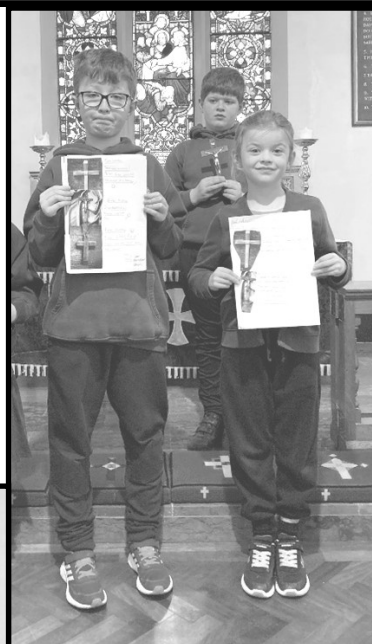

Katie Meakin: Letter of Thanks

As many residents already know, my mother, Katie Meakin, recently enjoyed her 100th Birthday. Unfortunately she is unable to go out of her home, not even able to venture into her garden which she so loved tending over the years, so we did our best for her to experience an exciting & happy day in her home.

Almost 50 people appeared at varying times with flowers & gifts in abundance. She received over 72 cards & the card from the King & Queen.

Mum joined the Derbyshire Fire Service in 1969 & when she retired 12 years later, she was a Senior Control Fire Officer, so her eldest grandson arranged for a fire engine & three crew members to join in her Birthday Celebration. Such a surprise for her & she enjoyed every minute of their company as did we all, especially her two great grandchildren!

For 4 years at the age of 17 years she joined the Women's Land Army where she fed the calves, milked the cows & transported milk churns to milk bars in Cheltenham & Evesham from an Estate in Aston Somerville in Worcestershire. In later years she was invited to Highgrove House where she was rewarded with a medal recognising the important part she played in the war. It was presented by the then Prince Charles.
