Now, here is an opportunity to have a go yourself, so why not try?


Coptic Journalling

Website & General Bookings Officer Roles: Update

General Bookings involve checking the Diary for availability, issuing the Booking Form and other relevant paperwork (usually done via email), hosting viewings if required, and participating in Open/Close duties (shared with other Committee Members), etc.

Speed Cameras - Hand Held and MVAS

Teams have continued to be out during April/May and June with now over 300 drivers 'booked' for speeding. With 10 trained volunteers and a second camera, it is hoped to achieve a session a week during Summer this year, to further encourage drivers to reduce speeds through the village. If you are interested in being part of a team please contact the Parish Clerk - or speak to any member of the Parish Council. MVAS (Mobile Activated Vehicle Signs) results for June show that of the 168,200 vehicles monitored 12,700 were doing more than 35mph. As a long-term solution the Parish Council are examining the possibility of an Average Speed Camera system shared amongst local villages. Watch this space!



Hedge-Cutting Co-operative

The first cut of the "Hulland Ward Hedge-Cutting Co-operative" has already taken place, with up to 2 more cuts scheduled to take place before this Autumn. The Co-operative now stretches from upper Dog Lane, Hulland to the Butterfly Conservation area of the Slangs, Hulland Ward.

Housing Developments

The completed Cameron Homes (33 houses) and Blue Line Homes (23 houses) developments - together with the Wheeldon Way development of 39 houses, which is currently under construction, plus permitted 'fill-ins', will add up to 103 new houses.

This is the number of new properties called for in the Derbyshire Dales Local Plan, for the Hulland Ward area, and scheduled to last until 2035.

An additional 16 houses on Land East of Dog Lane (and in excess of the Local Plan) are the subject of both an Appeal and a new Planning Application 23/00435/FUL. Both the earlier and the current application have been vigorously opposed by Hulland Ward Parish Council.

The New King Charles III Definitive Stamp

From 1st August, 2023 Stamps bearing King Charles III's profile become the norm. First issued for sale by Royal Mail on 4th April, 2023, the stamps are accompanied by a barcode.

What does this mean for 'old' Stamps bearing Queen Elizabeth's profile, and with no barcode? Well, put simply, these are no longer valid as from 1st August, 2023.

What should you do if you haven't used up your old stamps? There is a form on the Royal Mail website which you can complete to swap unused stamps for the new barcoded stamps to the equivalent value. The URL link is:-

Planning Success!

A successful result was achieved when Derbyshire Dales Planning Committee finally granted an application at Biggin Old Hall, over-ruling the Case Officer's recommendation to refuse for the second time. Definitely something to celebrate and the restoration project can now at last go ahead.

On a sad note for our local heritage, the original 17th Century farmhouse at Nether Hillside Farm has now been demolished.

Local support needed

After a successful campaign the recent Knockerdown/ Caffeine Machine planning Application was refused. Now, a 2nd Application has been received and the local group who set up the Petitions are doing this again. As well as asking for local support once more in signing the new Petitions, they are asking for people to write a response to Derbyshire Dales Planning, too.

As Chair of Biggin Parish, I will write a response to Planning on behalf of the Parish and Residents objecting to this new application and showing our support.

Durmot Murphy, our Councillor on the Derbyshire Dales District and Derbyshire County Councils (DCC), came up with a Masterstroke. He managed to persuade a Senior Engineer from the DCC Highways Department to make a site visit so he could experience the extremely dangerous situation of not only vehicles entering Hulland Village from off the A517, but also crossing the road from the Bus Stop.

Although we were offered a 30mph speed restriction in the Village, this did nothing to solve the safety problems on the hill. So, this offer was resoundly rejected by a large majority of Village residents. Instead we have asked for the money to be spent on slowing the traffic down on the hill as the safety concerns on the hill are many times more serious than in the Village, itself.

In conclusion, the Highways Department of DCC has promised to carry out a review of the signing on the A517 on each approach to the Village Green with a view of improving this and raising the awareness of motorists, as well as reinforcing the "Slow Down" message. Finally we have been told that we will be contacted further with their proposals in due course, so we await this contact with eager anticipation. *Tim Sadler*
