Village Hall Car Park Extension

Approval for the new Planning Application 23/01326/FUL has now been granted subject to normal planning conditions.

It is anticipated that satisfactory funding will now be in place by this Christmas, with a new target start date for this important project of April 2025.

Potential Closure of Hulland Ward Medical Centre by Henmore Health

Following the recent spate of text messages to residents of Hulland Ward, Hulland and Biggin of a proposal to close the Hulland Ward Medical Centre, the content of the text was discussed at the Parish Council Meeting on Monday, 7th October 2024 at Hulland Ward Village Hall.

Following discussions, the Parish Council unanimously opposed all plans to close Hulland Ward Medical Centre.

Hulland Ward Medical Centre has served the local community for over 30 years, until 3rd May 2022, when it was temporarily closed due to a short term labour shortage.

Your Parish Council believe Henmore Health are proficient, professional and capable of bringing Hulland Ward Medical Centre back online before the onset of Winter, to again provide a necessary service to the over **2,500 residents** who have been effected by the temporary closure of the Centre.

Your Parish Council says,

“Re-open the Hulland Ward Medical Centre and Put Patients First”

MVAS and Average Speed Cameras



Vehicle speed data along the Main Road, collected by the 2 MVA cameras (Mobile Activated Vehicle Signs) for September 2024 was as follows:



153,345 vehicles were recorded in total, with 27% exceeding 30mph, with 10 drivers exceeding 60mph.

The Parish Council hope to have reportable information on a suitable Average Speed Camera system through our Village (which would eliminate the problem of speeding 'overnight') by January 2025.

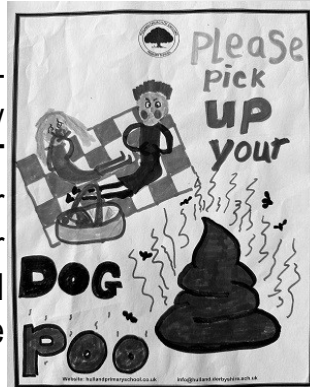
Wheeldon Way Development

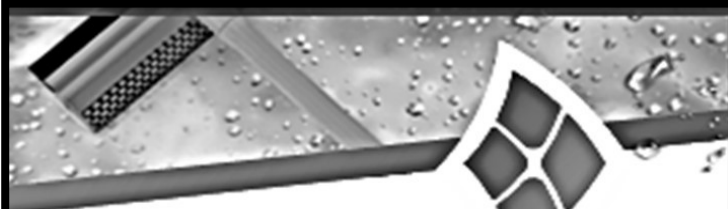

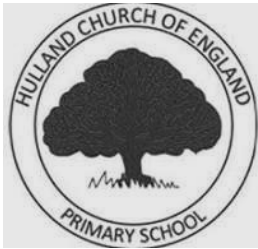

Brailsford & Hulland Medical Practice

HE: *Brailsford & Hulland Practice has had a rough time recently. What is its position now regarding ownership and stability?*

DS: The Practice came under Drs Maxwell-Jones & Partners (T/A: Henmore Health) ownership on 1st December, 2023. Within 60 days normal business was restored to GMS contract levels and financial stability returned. Since then, we have been rebuilding the Practice to Henmore Health's service and safety standards. We declared to the ICB ready for the CQC in September 2024.

HE: *How does this affect Brailsford's autonomy?*

DS: Now renamed 'Henmore Health - Brailsford Surgery', it shares sibling placement with 'Henmore Health - The Surgery' on Clifton Road, Ashbourne. As a sibling, Brailsford remains an independent GMS Contracted establishment obliged to deliver all service lines, but working with its Ashbourne sibling it shares appointment books and systems increasing access and convenience for all Patients in the South Dales. Hulland Ward site has been closed since 2021 and is expected to close permanently at the end of 2024 - the site returned to the landlords.

HE: *As to staffing levels, are there enough Doctors, Nurses and support staff for patients to see, now?*

DS: Over the 2 sibling sites, presently 11 GPs work at Henmore Health alongside an even larger Team of Allied Health Care Professionals including Clinical Pharmacists, Technicians, Advanced Practitioners, Nurses, Nurse Associates and Health Care Assistants, Physiotherapists and Mental Health Workers. Considered "Overborn" this represents an investment by Henmore Health to return the appointment book to reasonable lead times. Combining the administrative teams has brought efficiencies but no redundancies were made to support, clinical or dispensary staff meaning we are more than adequately staffed and there are no outstanding vacancies at time of writing.

HE: *Delays in answering telephone calls frustrates Patients. What is being done to improve this?*

DS: Brailsford has a legacy, obsolete telephone system that we cannot extract data from. Both Ashbourne and Brailsford are in a queue to receive new telephone systems with modern call queuing and management, data analysis & digital telephony via internet protocols later this financial year that will allow us to be more efficient to the phones. Both

siblings will be moving to digital Triage in late November. Presently only administrative contacts can be made by App and Website but after November, urgent Triage and 'on-the-day' appointments can be facilitated through requests made online, by 'phone or in person.

HE: *Regarding the Dispensary, is this now fully staffed and how can prescriptions be collected?*

DS: All 3 Dispensary Departments (The Surgery, Brailsford, Deliver Service Dispensary) are fully staffed. Prescriptions can be collected from 9am to 5.30pm Monday to Friday at Brailsford. By pre-arrangement they can be delivered for free to all Dispensing Patients by our delivery vehicles up to 5 days a week, with evening and daytime delivery windows available to meet our Patients' widest needs. Patients can opt to have their medication made available for collection at Ashbourne for convenience (and vice versa).

HE: *What happens now when a Patient calls for an appointment?*

DS: Routine appointments can be made as usual. For more immediate, urgent or 'on-the-day' needs Patients will be Triage'd by Trained Care Navigators (*we haven't employed receptionists for over a year*) and clinical staff to find the Practitioner best suited to their needs in the quickest time. This may be First Contact Physiotherapy, Advanced Clinical Practitioners or Pharmacists. This Triage & Treatment Team are managed and led by the Duty GP of the day. In most cases your needs will be met on the day. At time of writing the next routine GP appointment was available in 12 days. 'On-the-day' appointments are exactly that, available on the day. Patients are Triage'd for placement with the Clinician best qualified for their needs. We aim to service 2 out of 3 appointments at your chosen site but Triage'd appointments will be directed to the site with the most capacity to afford the greatest access for Patients. Brailsford is oversubscribed at the premises level by nearly 30% and we cannot fit all the necessary staff into the current building so we have to manage the room availability over both sites by joint rota. However, most routine appointments are available within a fortnight, some a lot less.

HE: *What are the future plans for the Practice?*

DS: It is clear that growth in Brailsford, Hulland Ward and other serviced Parishes will continue at

pace under Government plans for new housing and infrastructure in a significant swing to the area. The Brailsford Surgery has already outgrown its current premises so will need to more sustainable and fit-for-purposes premises - hopefully by the end of the decade. We hope this might include an upgrade to our Dispensary that can better serve patients in and out of Surgery hours and weekends with both 'Prescription and Over The Counter' (OTC) medications, and supplies such as 'Baby Care' and 'Wound Management' not yet available in Brailsford that, again, would benefit from our free delivery service. Henmore Health is a Fully-Qualified GP Training Practice, and we look forward to welcoming Brailsford into that academic honour after its re-inspection by the CQC in 2025.

HE: *What's the true reason for Hulland Ward closing?*

DS: Hulland Ward Medical Centre failed CQC standards which stated that it requires infrastructure upgrades and capacity beyond its walls, is not compatible with a modern Practice, and would only generate its own inequalities unable to deliver all services properly. The cost of utilities and employing support staff to keep the site running is not economically viable now so resources are better spent employing more clinical staff at a fully supported main site. Brailsford, itself, previously failed CQC inspections twice, narrowly escaping closure trying to spread resources thinly over both sites. We know this cannot be done well but can promise to deliver excellent services at the one site, Brailsford, but to do so the Hulland branch must close. Most of Hulland Ward's Patients are not resident in the namesake village with most in surrounding Parishes. Less than half of Brailsford's Patients live there. The site was chosen for its location along the A52. Like 'The Surgery', our service areas and catchment cover tens of square miles to hard-to-reach areas all over the Southern Derbyshire Dales. We work closely with Ashbourne Community Transport and its subsidiaries to ensure our Patients access our facilities. We will continue to do so. Our Dispensary Delivery Service free to all Dispensing Patients can take medication anywhere in the catchment up to 5 days a week to ensure everyone needing medication is reached. The Home Visiting Service operates across the service area for those housebound, augmented by our own Practice GPs when demand is high.
